## **Narratives**

#### **Disaster Damage:**

The 2017 hurricane season brought insurmountable devastation to Puerto Rico when in the month of September, the island experienced Category five (5) and four (4) storms, Hurricane Irma and Hurricane Maria. Hurricane Maria was the most devastating natural disaster to hit Puerto Rico since San Felipe made landfall nine decades ago in 1928. Since that time, the population has doubled in size from 1.5 million residents compared to today's population of 3.4 million. Hurricane Irma made landfall on September 6, 2017 as a Category five (5) storm with winds up to 100 miles per hour. The storm cut power to an estimated two-thirds of the main island, leaving communities ravaged. Just two (2) weeks later, Hurricane Maria made landfall on September 20, 2017 as a Category 4 storm measuring 35 miles in width, making direct impact with the 35-mile wide island. Hurricane Maria impacted the entirety of Puerto Rico with recorded winds up to 155 miles an hour, river surges up to 47 feet, massive mudslides, and localized catastrophic flooding reaching up to 38 inches. An estimated 64 lives were immediately lost in the storm with hundreds more lost to secondary conditions caused by lack of power, contaminated water sources, and limited to no access to healthcare services. Today over 90% of the island's power has been restored, however recurring outages continue to affect the still-fragile grid. Inundated by back-to-back storms, Puerto Rico experienced 100% impact from Hurricane Maria just two (2) weeks after surviving regional impact from Hurricane Irma. The subsequent impact of these storms compounded damage to the island leaving extremely vulnerable housing structures extensively damaged or completely leveled in almost every municipio. As a US territory located 1,000 miles from the mainland states, the Puerto Rico archipelago is isolated from the continental US and depends heavily on maritime commerce for major resources. Hurricane warnings were issued 37 hours3 before landfall, but due to the severity of Hurricane Maria and the trajectory of the storm, first responders were unable to preposition relief resources. Relief efforts and immediate aid were further delayed by up to three days due to the shutdown of significantly damaged seaports and airports. The geography of the main island further complicated relief efforts. Stretching 100 miles across and 35 miles top to bottom, the island is covered with vastly different terrain: rain forest, deserts, beaches, caves, oceans and rivers. Puerto Rico has three (3) main physiographic regions: the mountainous interior which covers approximately 60% of the island, the coastal lowlands, and the karst area characterized by underground drainage systems with sinkholes and caves. There are over 50 rivers and 60 watersheds that surged with flood waters when Maria hit. According to data gathered by FEMA Individual Assistance Program, hurricanes Irma and Maria caused damage to an estimated 1,067,6184 homes, the collapse or severe obstruction of numerous roads, and loss of power across the entire island. Post-storm conditions have only complicated relief efforts as residents had been left without essential services including power and clean water. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) recorded Hurricane Maria winds that reached up to 155 mph in the City of San Juan. Early estimates accurately captured extreme wind and rain threats, and a storm trajectory to impact the island head-on bef

ore proceeding northwest to the mainland US. Puerto Rico sustained hurricane force winds sweeping at maximum strength first through the islands of Vieques and Culebra then the northeast coast before sweeping westward across the main island. Wind and rain collapsed weak homes and buildings, uprooted trees, and lashed fragile power lines in every corner of the island causing a complete blackout. Severe flooding and mudslides occurred in every interior mountainous region of the island.



#### **Recovery Needs:**

Puerto Rico is committed to building back stronger and more resilient to future hazards. Activities supporting this commitment will not only enhance the quality of construction for life-saving protective measures, but also preserve the integrity of the federal investment contributed by the American people. The rebirth of Puerto Rico hinges on sustainable growth yielded by the influx of recovery monies. Through strategic partnership and resiliency planning, Puerto Rico will set the stage for long-term investment and economic return. Implementation of recovery activities will focus on innovation and the perpetual application of mitigation and resilience techniques.

With this opportunity to rebuild, Puerto Rico will increase housing opportunities and affirmatively promote housing choice throughout the housing market. Program implementation will be conducted in a manner which will not cause discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, disability, familial status, or national origin.

PRDOH will use housing counseling programs and whole community resilience programs to build programs informed by housing choice to provide affordable housing. Because planning decisions may affect racial, ethnic and low-income concentrations, these programs will help provide affordable housing choice in areas that are defined as low-poverty or non-minority where appropriate and in response to natural hazard related impacts. PRDOH will consider the impact of planning decisions on racial, ethnic, and low-income concentrations. This may include utilizing mapping tools and data to identify racially or ethnically-concentrated areas of poverty for the evaluation of possible impacts to those areas as well as to promote fair housing choice and to foster inclusive communities.

Puerto Rico will implement construction methods that emphasize quality, durability, energy efficiency, sustainability, and mold resistance. All rehabilitation, reconstruction, and new construction will be designed to incorporate principles of sustainability, including water and energy efficiency, resilience, and mitigation against the impact of future shocks and stressors.

Construction performed under the programs will adhere to the 2011 Puerto Rico building code.20 Importantly, the Code includes requirements regarding earthquake loads. This is vital as Puerto Rico must build structures that are resilient not only for hurricanes and wind, but for seismic activity as well. This is consistent with the goal of protecting people and property from harm; emphasizing high quality, durability, energy efficiency, sustainability, and mold resistance; supporting the adoption and enforcement of modern and/or resilient building codes and mitigation of hazard risk, including possible sea level rise, high winds, storm surge, and flooding, where appropriate; and implementing and ensuring compliance with the Green Building standards.

Puerto Rico will enforce procurement procedures that increase the use of sustainable standards, which may include FORTIFIED Home™ and Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified construction vendors.

For non-substantially rehabilitated housing structures, Puerto Rico will follow the HUD Community Planning and Development (CPD) Green Building Retrofit Checklist guidelines to the extent they are applicable to the construction methods utilized on the Island. When older or obsolete products are repla

ced as part of rehabilitation work, Puerto Rico will use products and appliances with ENERGY STAR labels, Water Sense labels, or Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP equivalent) designations.

In conducting its impact and unmet needs assessment for this CDBG-DR Action Plan, Puerto Rico has designed program objectives and supporting budgets to consider the additional costs associated with protecting housing and community investments from future disasters through eligible resilience activities.

# **Overall Progress Narrative:**

In the initial Action Plan, Puerto Rico established a foundation for a holistic and comprehensive recovery portfolio comprised of 19 programs with the initial allocation of \$1.5B and expanded and diversified the portfolio to 27 programs with the second allocation of \$8.2B in the Action Plan Amendment (Substantial Amendment). Since publication of the first Federal Notice on February 9, 2018, the Puerto Rico Department of Housing (PRDOH) has been working diligently to begin the use of the Community Development Block Grant for Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds allocated by the United States Congress and awarded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

On February 28, 2019, HUD approved the Substantial Amendment submitted by PRDOH, and its eight additional recovery programs. The methods of distribution outlined in the Substantial Amendment approved by HUD were derived from extensive unmet needs analysis and through feedback gathered by community engagement and public comment – the result being the foundation for a holistic and balanced recovery approach targeting housing needs first, and also including programs for economic development, planning, and infrastructure needs of Puerto Rico. Thus, the amended Action Plan sets forth the use of \$9,727,962,000 in CDBG-DR funds for a period of six (6) years, beginning upon execution of the corresponding Grant Agreement (discussed further below).

Over the course of the months following the signing of the original Grant Agreement, PRDOH worked closely with HUD to satisfy the Grant Special Conditions. Said special conditions were unique to Puerto Rico and were required by HUD in order to fully access the funds from the initial allocation of \$1.5B. These conditions were satisfied by PRDOH on January 31, 2019.

During Q1 2019, PRDOH completed requirements of the special conditions of the Grant Agreement, which included onboarding of new staff associated with the CDBG-DR Program and submission of programmatic policies and procedures for HUD review.

During Q1 PRDOH continued preparation for launch of programs under executed memorandums of understanding (MOUs) with the following partners, who are leads in implementing and administering programs as approved by HUD via the approved Action Plan:

- Department of Economic Development and Commerce (DDEC for its Spanish acronym)
- •Small Business Financing and Construction
- Commercial Revolving Loan
- •Puerto Rico Housing Finance Authority (AFV for its Spanish acronym)

With respect to taking preparative, proactive measures, staging, and sequencing programmatic launch components, PRDOH conducted key actions related to procurement and capacity building. PRDOH initiated several strategic procurements related to overall operations support as well as those specific to key programs. In addition, PRDOH initiated a range of procurements in order to adequately prepare for program launch, in anticipation of HUD approval of programmatic requirements mentioned previously. PRDOH partnered with municipios to understand local needs and prepared to support program launch and implementation specifically identifying areas of needed support for the municipios for the single-family Home Repair, Reconstruction, or Relocation Program. The PRDOH team independently conducted several capacity-building workshops with implementation partners to prepare for program launch. Further, the PRDOH team coordinated with HUD staff to collaboratively conduct capacity building workshops with implementation partners as well.

The DRGR Action Plan was approved on February 4, 2019.PRDOH worked with HUD staff and Technical Assistance providers, and submitted its first draw on February 8, 2019.

#### **Activity Description:**

The Housing Reconstruction Program provides funding to homeowners to repair damaged homes or rebuild substantially damaged homes in place in non-hazard areas. Reconstruction activity returns otherwise displaced families to their homes in their same community. Homes become eligible for reconstruction when the property estimated cost of repair exceeds \$48,000 or 50% of the current value115 – as confirmed through program inspection, or a feasibility inspection determines that reconstruction is required. Homes meeting this damage threshold will be reconstructed to include resilient measures in structural materials. Homes that may not be rebuilt in place due to legal, engineering or environmental constraints (permitting, extraordinary site conditions, etc.) will not be reconstructed and the homeowner will be provided relocation options.

## **Activity Progress Narrative:**

"Program Guidelines: PRDOH's Compliance Area reviewed the Program Guidelines Draft and provided comments. Program Guidelines were pre-approved by the Compliance Area after addressing comments received. PRDOH Leadership provided input on final programmatic decisions, including intake priorities, citizenship, alternate ownership documentation, and relocation. After Program Guidelines were completed their translation to Spanish was undertaken. Program Guidelines are pending posting on the CDBG-DR Website.

Environmental Review: The Tier 1 environmental review for all six (6) regions was completed and signed by the PRDOH during the month of January 2019. Findings of No Significant Impact (FONSI) and Notices of Intent for Request of Release of Funds (RROF) were published and the RROF submitted to HUD during the month of February 2019. During the month of March 2019, the PRDOH received and addressed comments to the Tier 1 from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Tier 1 ERRs were amended based on EPA comments. Authority to Use Grant Funds (AUGF) was received on March 21, 2019. Municipal Participation: First version of Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) for Municipal Participation were completed during the month of January 2019. The PRDOH's Legal Division approved the MOU templates. Materials for trainings to interested Municipalities were developed and completed in January 2019. Training sessions were provided during the months of January and February. Training sessions covered CDBG-DR Overview, Municipal Roles for the Program, Protection of PII, Intake, Duplication of Benefits, 2 CFR 200 Requirements, Program Outreach, Program Inspections, and Cross-Cutting Regulations. Representatives from sixty (60) Municipalities participated in the training sessions. Municipal Points of Contact for MOUs were identified. PRDOH ended the quarter with ongoing conversations with Municipalities regarding their participation in the program. PRDOH also completed the Municipalities' Capacity Assessments.

Program Documents Development: The following documents were developed during the quarter: (1) RFQ/RFP Template for Procurement of Inspection Services by Municipalities, (2) SOP for Subrecipient Procurements (including those by Municipalities), (3) Instructions for Municipal Development of Outreach Plans, (4) Instructions for Completion of MOUs by Municipalities, (5) Instructions for Completion of RFQ/RFP Template for Procurement of Inspection Services by Municipalities, (6) SOP for Program Area Review of Professional Services Invoices, (7) SOP for Subrecipient and Program Manager creation of Professional Services Invoice Packages, (8) SOP for Intake Review, (9) SOP for Eligibility Review, (10) SOP for Income Calculation, (11) Invoice Templates, and (12) Program Marketing Materials. Development of SOPs required for Program launch will continue during the 2nd quarter of 2019.

Procurement: PRDOH received a total of thirty (30) proposals in response to the Construction Management Services RFP during the month of January 2019. Evaluation of proposals began during the quarter and is still on-going. Regarding RFPs for Call Center Services, Environmental Consulting Services, and Program Management Services, the PRDOH Procurement Area is finalizing its review of the corresponding Evaluation Committee's Reports. It is expected that awards will be issued during the 2nd quarter of 2019.

Other Matters: Training sessions were provided to PRDOH Regional Directors to familiarize them with the Program. Use of the Permiso Verde as a green building standard was approved by HUD. Assessment of PRDOH Regional Office's viability for use as Intake Centers for the Program was completed. PRDOH provided presentation highlighting internal controls for the program to HUD during their site visit the second week of March."

#### **Activity Description:**

The Housing Reconstruction Program provides funding to homeowners to repair damaged homes or rebuild substantially damaged homes in place in non-hazard areas. Reconstruction activity returns otherwise displaced families to their homes in their same community. Homes become eligible for reconstruction when the property estimated cost of repair exceeds \$48,000 or 50% of the current value115 – as confirmed through program inspection, or a feasibility inspection determines that reconstruction is required. Homes meeting this damage threshold will be reconstructed to include resilient measures in structural materials. Homes that may not be rebuilt in place due to legal, engineering or environmental constraints (permitting, extraordinary site conditions, etc.) will not be reconstructed and the homeowner will be provided relocation options.

#### **Location Description:**

The funding is available to be used in all Puerto Rico municipalities affected by the hurricanes across the island.

## **Activity Progress Narrative:**

"Program Guidelines: PRDOH's Compliance Area reviewed the Program Guidelines Draft and provided comments. Program Guidelines were pre-approved by the Compliance Area after addressing comments received. PRDOH Leadership provided input on final programmatic decisions, including intake priorities, citizenship, alternate ownership documentation, and relocation. After Program Guidelines were completed their translation to Spanish was undertaken. Program Guidelines are pending posting on the CDBG-DR Website.

Environmental Review: The Tier 1 environmental review for all six (6) regions was completed and signed by the



PRDOH during the month of January 2019. Findings of No Significant Impact (FONSI) and Notices of Intent for Request of Release of Funds (RROF) were published and the RROF submitted to HUD during the month of February 2019. During the month of March 2019, the PRDOH received and addressed comments to the Tier 1 from the Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Tier 1 ERRs were amended based on EPA comments. Authority to Use Grant Funds (AUGF) was received on March 21, 2019.

Municipal Participation: First version of Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) for Municipal Participation were completed during the month of January 2019. The PRDOH's Legal Division approved the MOU templates. Materials for trainings to interested Municipalities were developed and completed in January 2019. Training sessions were provided during the months of January and February. Training sessions covered CDBG-DR Overview, Municipal Roles for the Program, Protection of PII, Intake, Duplication of Benefits, 2 CFR 200 Requirements, Program Outreach, Program Inspections, and Cross-Cutting Regulations. Representatives from sixty (60) Municipalities participated in the training sessions. Municipal Points of Contact for MOUs were identified. PRDOH ended the quarter with ongoing conversations with Municipalities regarding their participation in the program. PRDOH also completed the Municipalities' Capacity Assessments.

Program Documents Development: The following documents were developed during the quarter: (1) RFQ/RFP Template for Procurement of Inspection Services by Municipalities, (2) SOP for Subrecipient Procurements (including those by Municipalities), (3) Instructions for Municipal Development of Outreach Plans, (4) Instructions for Completion of MOUs by Municipalities, (5) Instructions for Completion of RFQ/RFP Template for Procurement of Inspection Services by Municipalities, (6) SOP for Program Area Review of Professional Services Invoices, (7) SOP for Subrecipient and Program Manager creation of Professional Services Invoice Packages, (8) SOP for Intake Review, (9) SOP for Eligibility Review, (10) SOP for Income Calculation, (11) Invoice Templates, and (12) Program Marketing Materials. Development of SOPs required for Program launch will continue during the 2nd quarter of 2019.

Procurement: PRDOH received a total of thirty (30) proposals in response to the Construction Management Services RFP during the month of January 2019. Evaluation of proposals began during the quarter and is still on-going. Regarding RFPs for Call Center Services, Environmental Consulting Services, and Program Management Services, the PRDOH Procurement Area is finalizing its review of the corresponding Evaluation Committee's Reports. It is expected that awards will be issued during the 2nd quarter of 2019.

Other Matters: Training sessions were provided to PRDOH Regional Directors to familiarize them with the Program. Use of the Permiso Verde as a green building standard was approved by HUD. Assessment of PRDOH Regional Office's viability for use as Intake Centers for the Program was completed. PRDOH provided presentation highlighting internal controls for the program to HUD during their site visit the second week of March."

Applicants who are otherwise eligible for rehabilitation or reconstruction assistance under the housing program who need remedial and curative title/ownership actions will be prioritized for limited legal services assistance. Limited legal services to resolve title issues will be performed under the direction or supervision of one or more attorneys duly licensed and authorized to practice law within the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico under rates that are subject to program approval. Homeowners unable to resolve title issues with the assistance of the legal service providers may be recommended for longer-term assistance, separate and apart from the services provided under this program.

Program Guidelines underwent review of the PRDOH's Compliance Area and have been pre-approved for implementation. Service providers' proposals are under evaluation by PRDOH designated committee. Advertising agency for Program Outreach was selected through bidding; now in Legal Division for contract drafting and document verification process. Continued evaluation and correction of Program Guidelines on HUD comments. Working on program's Household Income Calculation method



and on Program Notifications and Documents. Working on Title Clearance Process and Applicant Eligibility SOP's (advanced). More than 50 curriculums were evaluated and over 30 job applicants were interviewed. First group of 10 candidates were selected for Title Clearance and Reporting Specialists positions.

Also, during this period PRDOH assisted AFV by providing guidance on matters related to Program implementation. PRDOH guidance allowed AFV to proceed expediently to perform the corresponding environmental and feasibility reviews. Finally, PRDOH made further efforts to formalize the activities in the Program by scheduling recurring meetings and developing documents to keep track of assignments.

The Home Energy Resilience program will provide homeowners or renters a voucher for a gas or solar powered water heater, and/or gas-powered stove, installation and related appurtenances so that res- idents can perform basic functions such as showering and preparing meals at home in the event of a power outage.122 Vouchers may be used at PRDOH pre-qualified vendors and installers. The cap in value per applicant is \$6,000, with only one system installation per home. Equipment will be installed and affixed to the residence. Priority will be given to the elderly and limited to low-income residents. Priority for the elderly does not preclude assistance to other eligible applicants. PRDOH anticipates providing home energy resilience improvements to at least 6,000 families under this program.


